She started bowling on Saturday Nite Breakers at Astro Bowl in the early 1990's and is still on that league. She subbed for many leagues and often times she bowled 6 or 7 nights a week.

Deb came on the board during the 1995-1996 season as a director and has only missed 2 times in all the years. She became Sgt. at Arms when Pat Wedge left the board to move to Ohio. After Barb Brown resigned in 2000 she became the Secretary of the board. This was at a time when we were still learning the Winlabs program. We made it through that with a few battle scars but it was a great learning experience. She is still doing a lot of work as the Awards recorder. *Deb* was involved with some of the other board members (both the men's and the women's) to get started on the merger for the 2 associations and the youth.

Deb has bowled in many state tournaments over the years. The first city tournament was 1983 and believes they came in 5th place. She has been bowling in National Tournaments since 1993 and will keep on for as long as she is able. It is a great experience to meet all the people from around the country.

Deb has been tournament manager several times for the city tournaments with the help of the board. It is hard work but she had fun doing it. She has won 1 tournament and that was the Higley Tournament in 2007 with Pam Yoder, Doug Yoder and Mark Yoder. It was an honor to be bowling with them and she is glad she was able to help them win this tournament.

Her highest series was a 645 and highest game was a 277. She has had many 200's but the last couple of years have been rough on her. She has had many high 500 series and her highest average has been a 171.
